

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PHOTOGRAPHY AND THE 1851 GREAT EXHIBITION

With a Foreword by Tristram Hunt and an essay by Nicholas Burnett.

The Great Exhibition of the Works of Industry of All Nations, held in London from May to October of 1851, was the genesis of the Victoria and Albert Museum. This book makes extensive use of the V&A collections and is published to accompany the opening of the V&A Photography Centre.

Photography and the 1851 Great Exhibition is the first comprehensive study of the seminal gathering of photographs and photographic equipment that marked the global launch of the form. It examines the role and impact of photography at the 1851 Great Exhibition and beyond, drawing together two decades of research to create a broader understanding of the stepchange in image making and distribution represented by that event.



The role of the Great Exhibition in furthering the cause of photography and its impact on illustration, printing, publishing, and the arts has been largely underappreciated. 1851 saw a massive change in the creation and dissemination of graphic information. Photographic images of the building, its contents and their display played a critical role in this quantum leap.


The scale and scope of photography of the Great Exhibition is made evident through reproductions of images produced by both amateur and professional photographers,

some of which are the only known images of now lost works of art. Also shown and examined are prints produced by traditional reprographics and lithographs and the photographic originals from which they were derived.

This study is based on contemporary sources, including official publications, the archive of the Royal Commission, the correspondence of William Henry Fox Talbot, letters, newspapers, books, and articles in serial and periodical publications, as well as the *Reports by the Juries*, from which all 154 photographic images are reproduced in these pages. 




Since 1994, Oak Knoll Fest has been a destination for printers, scholars, collectors, librarians, and booksellers to congregate in historic New Castle, Delaware. What began as a yearly venture during the first weekend of October, Oak Knoll Fest eventually became a biennial event in 2010. Each Fest has had a theme: 2010 was on "The Importance of Artists' Books," 2012 was "Fine Press Books in the 21st Century," 2014 was "Buying and Selling Fine Press Books," and 2016 was "Text and Inspiration for Fine Press Titles." The theme for 2018 theme was "Bringing It on Home," celebrating the history and importance of fine press book fairs. The Fest in was from October 5-7, 2018.


David Sellers of Pied Oxen Printers designed and printed the title page, Introduction, and colophon (in addition to his own broadside), using



MONIQUE LALLIER: A RETROSPECTIVE

Catalogue for an exhibition at the Guilford College Art Gallery in Greensboro, NC from October 29, 2018 to January 6, 2019, covering 46 years of fine bindings created by Monique Lallier. The exhibition draws from private lenders and institutional collections. With appreciations by Theresa Hammond, Ara Serjoie, Peter Geraty, and Karen Hanmer.

Monique Lallier is known for her creative and thoughtful approaches to the subjects of her binding projects. Her use of unusual materials such as eggshells, pewter, colorful wires, agates, lizard and snake skin -- even her own

hair – and innovative techniques including cutouts, reveals, popups, and moveable parts make her bindings both distinctive and dynamic. Her binding of *My Antonia* by Willa Cather won a Best Binding award in an international exhibition at the Chicago Public Library in 2006. Her 2016

binding of *Pantagruel* (below, left) was awarded a Silver Prize at the International Competition of Designer Bookbinders.

Lallier supplies entertaining descriptions of the bindings from the maker's perspective, telling brief stories of projects and processes. Each binding is illustrated with expert color photographs, often from several angles and in various states of openness and closure. The variety of design, material, and technique make for a surprise on every page and an extraordinary collective impression.

Monique Lallier has served as director of the American Academy of Bookbinding and president of the Association des Relieurs du Quebec. In 2010 the Guild of Book Workers (New York) presented her with the Laura Young award for service as Chair of the Standards of Excellence annual conference from 1988 to 2000. She is married to the British bookbinder Don Etherington.





Richard J. Wolfe (1928-2017) was a rare book librarian, practicing marbler, and collector of marbled papers and books about marbling. This book is the result of more than 25 years of research and practical experience. Wolfe tracked down and sorted out historical records of marbling from their original sources, drawing on his own extensive experience as a practitioner to write eloquently on technical and stylistic questions. The resulting study puts all aspects of this fascinating craft in proper perspective.

When first published, *Marbled Paper* was immediately recognized as the most comprehensive study of marbling to that point, and its status as the standard history of the subject is undiminished. With the goal of making it available again to scholars, students, and practitioners, Oak Knoll Press is pleased to be able to present this second edition in cooperation with the Wolfe family, completed with corrections left by the author.



JOSEF HALFER AND THE REVIVAL OF THE ART OF MARBLING PAPER



by Richard J. Wolfe

In this limited edition book, which he was refining when he died, Richard Wolfe examines the contributions of Josef Halfer, one of the most important figures in the history of paper marbling. Wolfe had written a Historical Introduction and roughly translated a number of Halfer's "little texts" on marbling. Sid Berger kindly took on the role of editor to help complete the text and translations so that Oak Knoll could bring Wolfe's last major project to publication.

Josef Halfer practiced and taught marbling roughly three centuries after the craft had appeared in Europe, at a time when paper marbling was in decline and being replaced by mechanically-produced substitutes. However, his innovations coincided with advances in chemistry, biochemistry and bacteriology, and he was able to apply those developments to solving problems that had long inhibited progress in the marbling art. The techniques that Halfer pioneered enabled marblers to take the craft to new artistic levels, allowing more detailed patterns to be achieved than ever before, and resulting in the most delicate, intricate and beautiful forms that the medium is capable of producing. Includes examples of Halfer's techniques, executed by the author.

ROBERT GRANJON: LETTER CUTTER (1513-1590): AN OEUVRE-CATALOGUE

by Hendrik D. L. Vervliet

This book, by typographic scholar Hendrik Vervliet, is a survey of the life and work of the sixteenth-century letter-cutter Robert Granjon (1513–1590). With his contemporary Claude Garamont, he is considered one of the best and most influential figures in the history of type design.

Vervliet begins with a biography, recounting Granjon's career as a punchcutter and publisher during periods in Paris, Lyons, Antwerp, and Rome. A freelance craftsman, Granjon wandering throughout Europe in search of markets in which to earn his livelihood selling sets of matrices of his founts.

Granjon's most durable contributions are his Italics, his Flowers, his Civilités (a new rendering of the old French Bastarda letter), and his Slavic and Oriental founts, whose elegance equals the calligraphy of the best manuscripts. The author devotes several chapters to chronologies of Granjon's publications and founts, and to classifications of his types. The final long chapter consists of facsimile reproductions of Granjon's types, including Arabic, Armenian, Civilité, Cyrillic, Greek, Hebrew, Italic, Music, Phonetic, Roman, and Syriac founts, as well as Script initials, Flowers, and Varia.


Primarily intended as a tool, this work aims for completeness and reliability of attributions, and it will be of great interest to book and type historians. Design and typography by Alastair Johnston.

Hendrik Vervliet worked until 1968 at the Plantin-Moretus Museum,

Antwerp. From 1969 onwards he served as Librarian of the University of Antwerp. He held the Professorship of Book History at the University of Amsterdam from 1974 up to his retirement in 1990. In 2011 he was honored with the Individual Laureate Award by the American Printing History Association.




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A DIRECTORY OF DELAWARE PHOTOGRAPHERS 1839-1900 AND BEYOND

by William A. McKay

A Directory of Delaware Photographers is an extensively researched study of historical information about photographers working in the state of Delaware from the dawn of practical photography up to the early twentieth century.

The author's inspiration for this book was a monograph by Jon Williams, formerly of Hagley Museum and Library, that covered only Wilmington from 1839 to 1860. From that starting point, he set about finding as much professional and personal information as possible about all Delaware photographers who owned a studio, and their employees.

Primary sources were: letters, including those written by several Delaware photographers to the DuPont family; newspaper archives; and city directories from 1845-1915. The sensational style of some of the newspaper articles, in particular, makes for entertaining reading.



The main directory is a list of all known photographic workers, with transcriptions of correspondence, newspaper articles, obituaries, advertisements, and other surviving sources of information. Appendices cover partnerships, locations, photographic media, licenses, business listings, and known amateur photographers. On the accompanying CD are reproductions of trade cards, stereopticon cards, daguerreotypes and other photographic prints, newspaper articles, patents, IRS records, business licenses, and more.


In the Service of Scholarship is a history of one of the leading printing firms of the twentieth century. It is also a character study and biography of Harold Hugo (1910-1985), whose career at Meriden Gravure began at the age of fourteen and continued until his retirement as president in 1975. During his tenure, Hugo brought the company to standards of excellence that earned worldwide recognition for art reproduction of the highest quality.

This is the first full account of the hundred-year history of the company and of the man who guided it to, and during, the period of its greatest success. It records the practices that were employed to advance illustration printing during the era of film-based printing technology, from collotype and letterpress to offset lithography.

The author was associated with Meriden Gravure for thirty years and regarded Harold Hugo as his mentor. He offers many anecdotes and insights reflecting Hugo's leadership of the company. These accounts are supplemented by material from interviews conducted during Harold Hugo's lifetime and by contributions from the Hugo family and others.



George Macy started the Limited Editions Club with backing from investors in the heyday of the stock market of 1929. The first book shipped during the week of the stock market collapse. The story of how the Limited Editions Club survived as a combination book club and fine press/publishing house through more than 80 years of ups and downs is a fascinating one.


Macy worked closely with such designers and printers as W. A. Dwiggins, Frederic Warde, the Grabhorns, William Kittredge, Bruce Rogers, Hans Mardersteig, Francis Meynell, T. M. Cleland, Fredric Goudy, and D. B. Updike. Contributing to LEC books were the foremost illustrators of the day, as well as such artists as Picasso, Matisse, Rodin, George Grosz, Edward Steichen, and Edward Weston.

Author Carol Grossman began collecting the LEC in the 1960s and has been conducting research for many years. In addition to presenting the rich history of the enterprise and the people involved in great detail, she examines the legacy and reputation of the books left to bibliophiles, scholars, booksellers, and collectors.

The History of the Limited Editions Club was designed by Jerry Kelly and is embellished with over 90 illustrations in color showing bindings, title and text page designs, artwork, sketches, notes, and ephemera.

THE PRIVATELY PRINTED BIBLE

Private & Fine Press E ditions of Biblical Texts in the British Isles and North America ¶ 1892-2000

The Privately Printed Bible is the first book to offer a broad survey of the history of private and fine press printings of biblical texts. The author focuses on English-language examples and includes more than 500 works in his study. He begins with the late nineteenth century revival of printing which took place in England under the influence of William Morris, and continues on through the twentieth century. Along the way he describes key texts, such as the Doves Bible, the Oxford Lectern Bible, the Golden Cockerel Four Gospels, the Spiral Press Ecclesiastes, the Pennyroyal Caxton Bible, and the Arion Press Bible. He also discusses lesser-known works that are part of the story.

The book is divided into five chapters dealing with the historical context and specific generations of printers. Over 100 illustrations in color show the aesthetics of layout, design and illustration taken up by various presses. The book also contains a number of checklists, tables, and graphs. Within each time period, the author

focuses on the individual presses, providing context on their development and their interest in printing biblical texts. Much attention is given to the production and to the appearance and features of the books themselves. Designed by Jerry Kelly.



THE ARCHITECTURE OF LIBRARIES IN WESTERN CIVILIZATION

From the Minoan Era to Michelangelo

The Architecture of Western Libraries, from the Minoan era to Michelangelo deals with the architectural evolution of the spaces in which written and graphic material was kept, from the Minoan times to the Italian Renaissance (ca. 1600 BCE- 1600 CE). Nowadays these rooms are known as "libraries"; however, the library acquired its present form through a turbulent journey. The five chapters that comprise the book cover the Greek world, the Roman world, the Byzantine period, the Western Middle Ages, and the Renaissance.

Author K. Sp. Staikos examines in detail the special features of the chambers used to store books in public, private, monastic and palace libraries. The main aim of this study is to familiarize the wider public with the distinctive architectural traits of the library, as well as with the people who contributed to the preservation of the heritage of written documents. In addition, special mention is made of the political and religious circumstances that affected the architectural form of libraries throughout ages and cultures.

THE MEDIEVAL GIRDLE BOOK


Between the 14th and 16th centuries a little-known book format, now called the girdle book, was used throughout various European countries. The girdle book is distinguished by a cover that extends beyond the limits of the book and may end in a knot, hook or ring, or may be left ungathered. By this extension the book was hung from the belt, so when swung up it could be read without detaching it from the belt.

Today there are only twenty-six known examples identified and documented in collections worldwide. In *The Medieval Girdle Book*, the author provides a comprehensive look at these extremely rare books. Contrary to previous assumptions that only clerics and the religious used girdle books, the author shows that they also contain legal, medical, and philosophical contents. Thia study is the first thorough treatment of all known girdle books.

Each book is examined in detail, documenting its historical context, provenance, and owners or institutions associated with it, and describing each from the book-binder's perspective, including the materials and processes of construction. This book is illustrated with nearly 270 color photographs taken by the author or reproduced from contemporary works of art.



Most manuals on bookbinding tend to provide an outline of basic techniques, but do little to provide detailed information on specific aspects of the craft.


A topic often overlooked is how to create endbands (also called "headbands"), those structural and decorative bands made of plain linen or hemp, silk or cotton thread, that one can see at the head and tail of the spine of a book.


The third edition of this classic manual has been updated and expanded by Jenny Hille. It is a step-by-step guide showing how to create fourteen different types of historical endbands, including Coptic, Ethiopian, Islamic, Greek, Armenian, French,

STEAM-DRIVEN SHAKESPEARE

OR MAKING GOOD BOOKS CHEAP: FIVE VICTORIAN ILLUSTRATED EDITIONS

Steam-Driven Shakespeare considers five major Victorian illustrated editions of Shakespeare, published by Charles Knight, Robert Tyas, George Routledge, John Cassell, and John Dicks between 1838 and 1869. These five publishers dominated the Victorian market for illustrated editions of Shakespeare for some thirty years. Their success was dependent upon the introduction of steam-driven printing presses and paper-making machines, and other new technologies.

The publishers' innovative use of such resources enabled them to mass produce and distribute inexpensive books to an increasingly wide readership. The chapters show how each publisher, when adjusting to the technological changes, had to assemble a coordinated workforce (editors, compositors, proof readers, artists, engravers, printers) that could meet the deadlines imposed by the timetable of serial publication, the format used for the initial publication of all five editions.

The book explores the genesis of each edition, the ideological bent of each publisher, the makeup and workings of each publishing workforce, the format and pricing structure of each edition, its use of illustrations, and distribution systems. THE UNCOLLECTED A. EDWARD NEWTON



A. Edward Newton (1864-1940) was a major figure in the book-collecting world of the early twentieth-century not only for his extensive library (some 10,000 volumes) focusing on the 18th and 19th centuries but also because of his writings in which he shared his enthusiasms. AN ACTOR'S LIBRARY DAVID GARRICK, BOOK COLLECTING AND LITERARY FRIENDSHIPS

An Actor's Library is the first major academic study of the library of David Garrick, the celebrated eighteenth-century actor and theatre manager. Book collecting was a lifelong preoccupation for him, and he assembled a general library of over 3,000 volumes and a renowned dramatic library of ca. 1,300 old plays, the latter bequeathed to the British Museum in 1779. The library was recognised as an unrivalled scholarly resource by contemporary editors of Shakespeare and other early English dramatists, and by literary and music historians. Garrick extended borrowing privileges to friends such as Samuel Johnson, Charles Burney, Thomas Percy, George Steevens and Thomas Warton.

The author's interdisciplinary approach exploits the archival legacy of Garrick and his wife, their contemporaries, and Mrs. Garrick's two executors, largely unpublished and unstudied until now. Through a process of bibliographical detective work, Smith located over 200 books with a Garrick provenance, a number with bookplates, inscriptions and other marks of ownership.

Nicholas D. Smith is an archivist at the Victoria and Albert Museum, London, and was curator of the V&A display, "David Garrick: Book Collector" (September 2016 - May 2017).
